



GPO Home App Manual

For an effortless experience and to ensure you make the most of all the available features

Download the app to your smartphone from Google Play for Android phones or the App Store for iPhone. Follow the simple instructions to quickly install the app and set up GPO Home. Discover the app's intuitive interface and take advantage of its features for the efficient management and control of your home heating. Experience a comfortable and personalized heating solution with the GPO Home app, designed for convenience and always within reach.

The GPO Home app offers two access methods:

- 1. Registration:**

Registration involves creating an account that provides full access to all app features and allows you to save personal settings and data for future use.

- 2. Login Without Registration:**

This option lets you use the app without creating an account. However, please note that certain features, such as the timer, creating and editing heating panel operating modes, are not available in this mode.

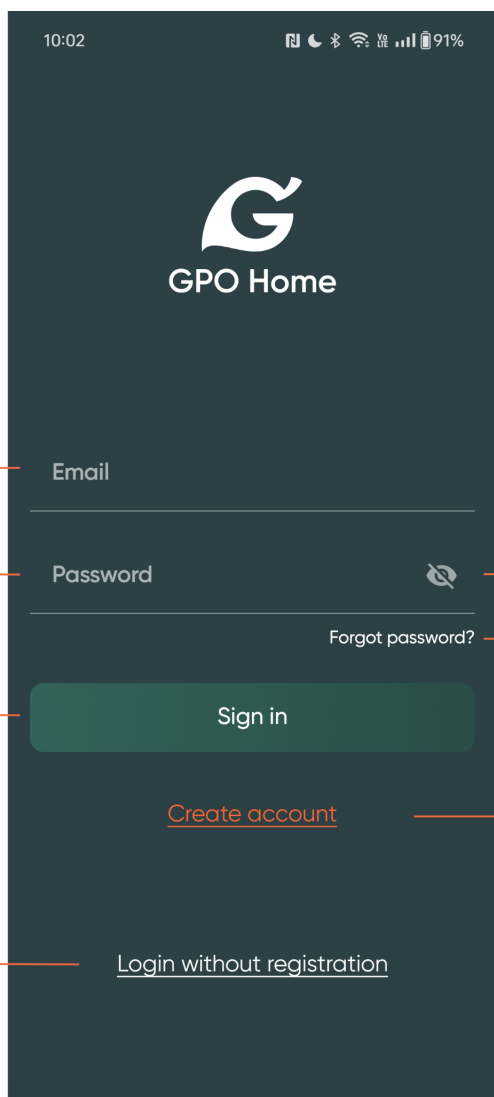
Unregistered accounts can be used up to 30 days after which they are deleted. Logging out of your unregistered account will erase all settings and connected devices associated with it. You can also start using an unregistered account and register later, saving your settings.

Choose the access method that best suits your needs. If you have any questions or need additional assistance, feel free to contact our support team.

1. **Email:** Enter the email you used during registration.
2. **Password:** Enter the password you created for your account.
 - 2.1. Tap on the crossed out eye icon to see the password you typed. Tap again to hide the password.
3. **Forgot your password?** Tap “Forgot password?” to recover your password easily*.
4. **Sign In:** Tap “Sign In” to log into your GPO Home account.

5. Tap “**Create account**” to register a new account.**

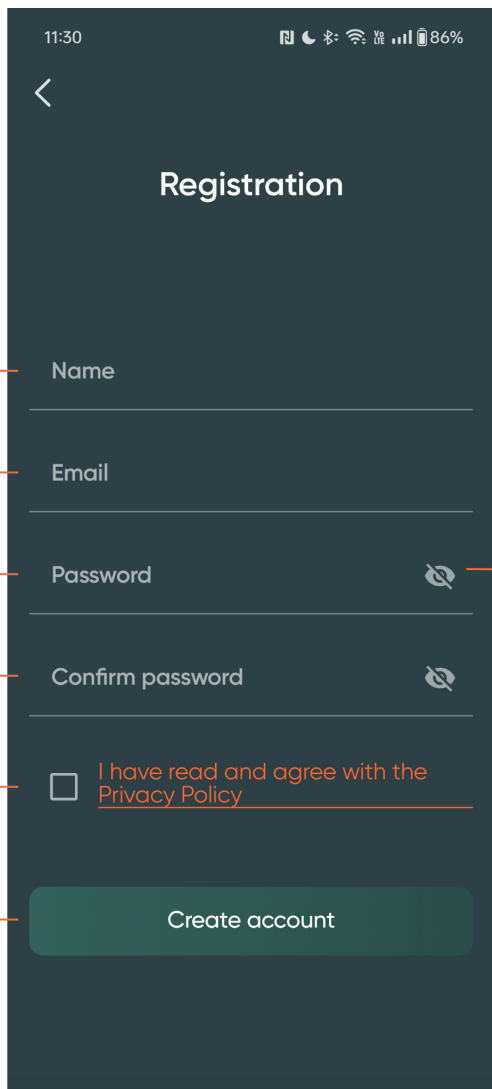

6. **Create account:** Tap the "Create account" button to complete the registration process.

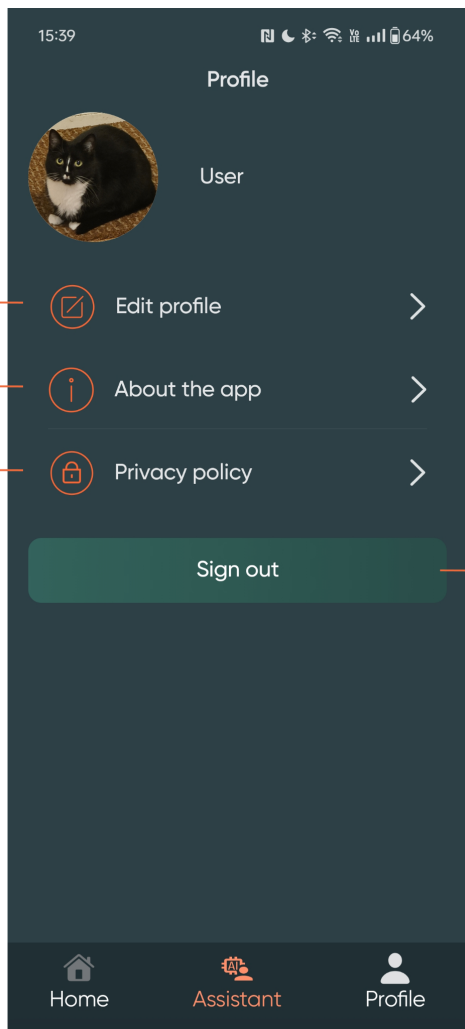

Under your profile, you'll find your name and a customizable profile picture, along with general app information and the Privacy Policy.

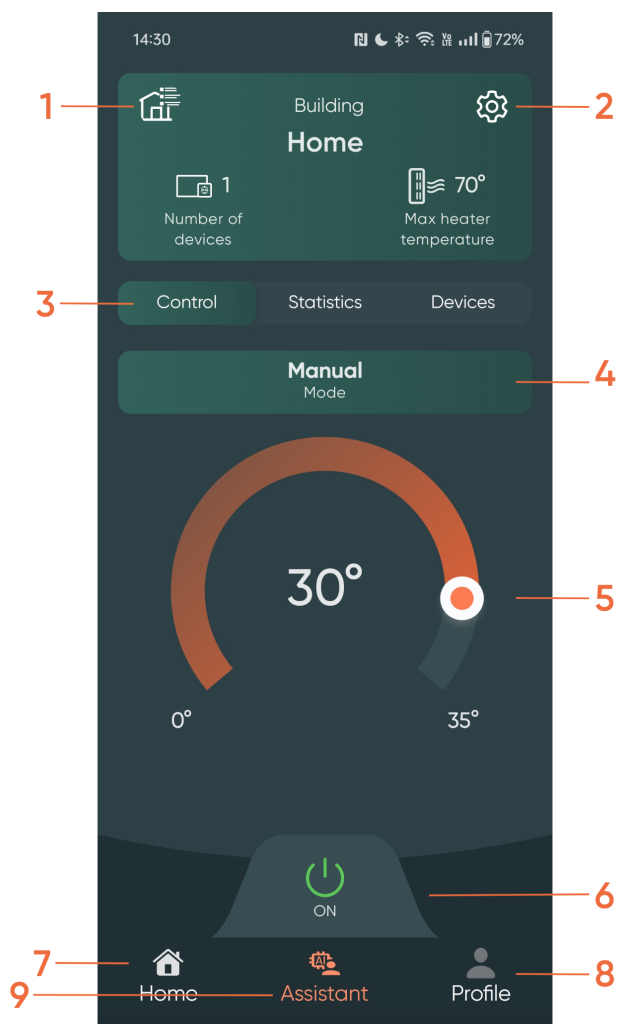
Unregistered account

An unregistered account will be able to register by tapping "Complete registration."

Profile Settings and Information

1. **Edit profile:** Tapping "Edit profile" will take you to a new screen where you can:
 - 1.1. edit your name;
 - 1.2. change your profile picture;
 - 1.3. delete your account.
2. **About the app:** Under "About the app" you can view the app version and general information.
3. **Privacy policy:** Tapping "Privacy policy" allows you to revisit the privacy terms.
4. **Sign out:** To switch accounts, tap the "Sign out" button. This logs you out of your current account and redirects you to the login screen.

HOME SCREEN



1. **Manage your buildings:** Tap here to manage your buildings. From there, you can view, customize, or add buildings to your list.

A **building** represents a single residence, such as a house or apartment, but it can also be used for spaces like offices, garages, or other structures.

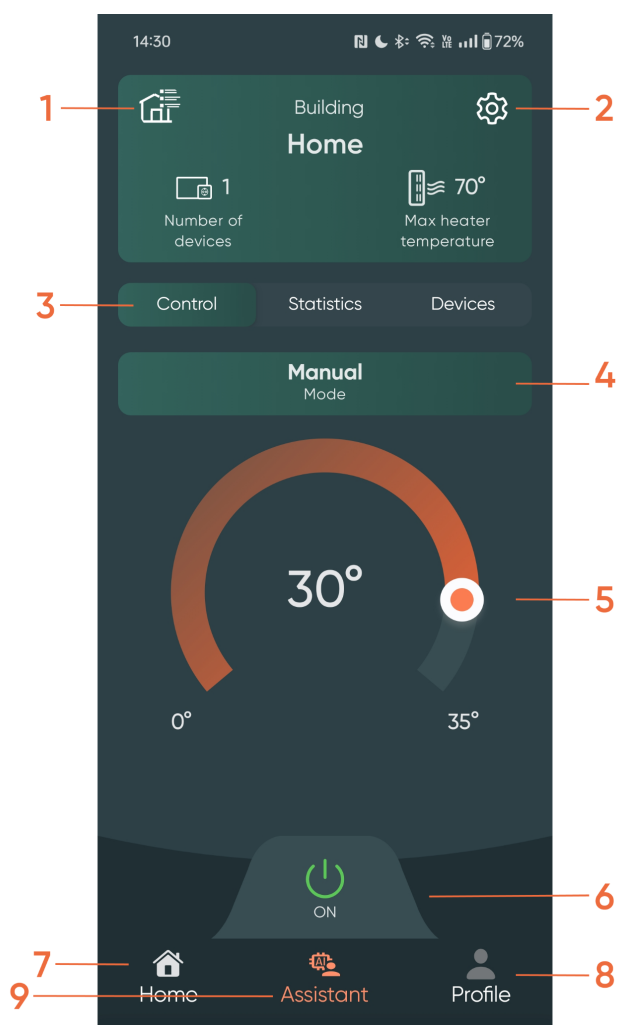
2. **Current building:** Tap here to access the settings of your current building.
3. Navigate between three tabs that let you:
 - 3.1. **Control:** Adjust your building's temperature settings or monitor power usage if sockets are added.
 - 3.2. **Statistics*:** Track and manage power consumption, viewing data by time period or total usage.
 - 3.3. **Devices**:** Organize and manage devices in your current building, either by groups or individually.
4. **Weekly modes:** Use the button to explore weekly modes and switch to your preferred schedule. You can customize existing modes or add/remove them as needed***.

HOME SCREEN



5. With manual mode in use you can adjust the temperature directly from the home screen. Simply use the slider to set your desired temperature.

5.1. Choosing a mode will disable the option to manually adjust the temperature from the home screen

5.2. When sockets are added, the home screen switches to displaying overall power consumption instead.

6. **Turn Devices ON/OFF:** Tap here to turn all of the devices in your building ON or OFF.

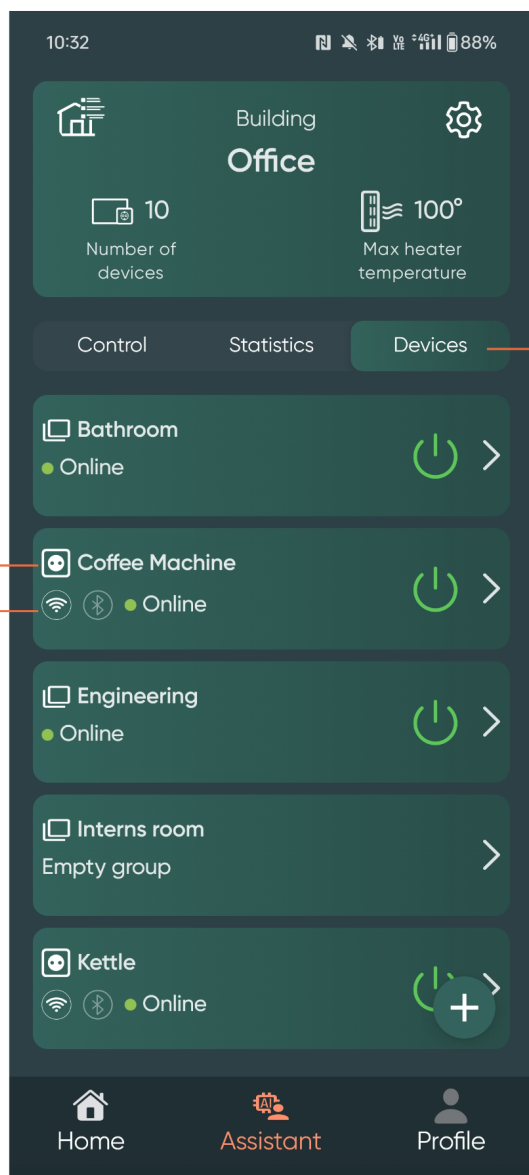
7. **Home:** Tap here to return to the home screen.

8. **Profile:** Tap here to access your profile.

9. **AI Assistant:** Tap here to use our AI Assistant and control your system conveniently with voice commands.*

DEVICES



Device List

This tab displays the list of current devices in your building. Along with their names and statuses, you can access each device's or group's settings by tapping its button*. Devices are listed either separately or within groups you have created.

Navigation and Symbols

1. Navigate the home screen using these tabs. Tap on **"Devices"** to reach this tab.

2. **Symbols:** Here, you'll see a symbol representing the type of device and its name. There are four symbols in total:

- 2.1.  - heater.
- 2.2.  - socket.
- 2.3.  - group of devices**.
- 2.4.  - heater (socket with a sensor)***.

3. **Connection status:** This row displays the device's connection status and connection mode, with the current connection mode highlighted.

ADD A HEATER

To **add a heater** to your account follow these steps:

1. **Go to the Home Screen:** tap the “+” button in the bottom-right part.

- 1.1. Alternatively you can add a device straight to a group. To do this choose the group you want, go to the “Devices” tab and tap the “+” button.

2. **Select Device Type:** From the pop up menu choose the type of device you want to add - in this case the heater.

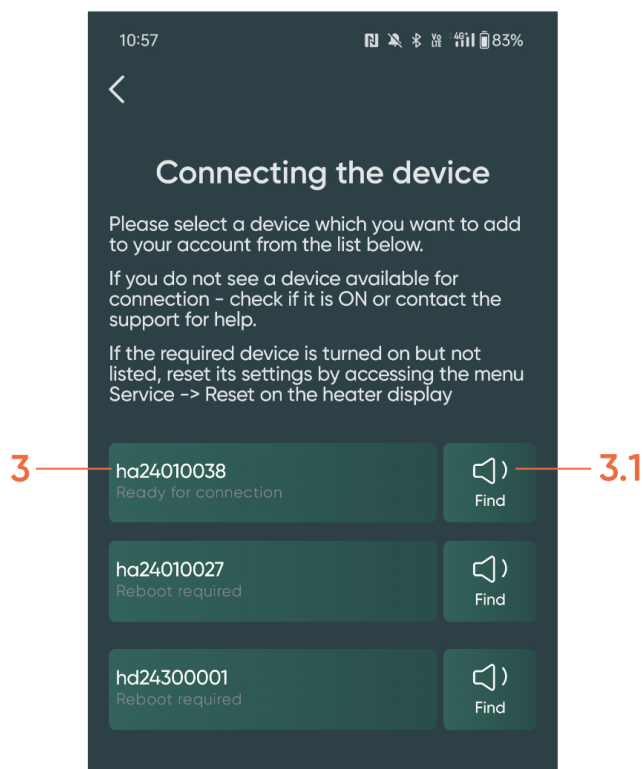
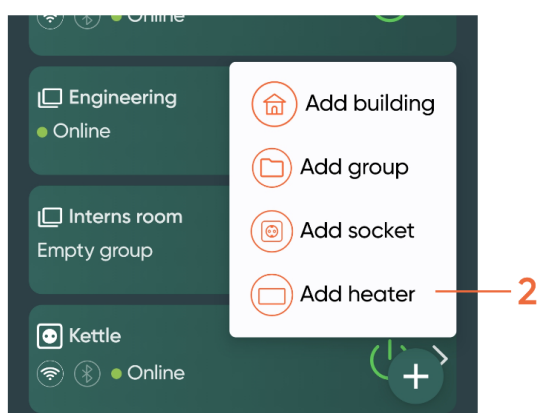
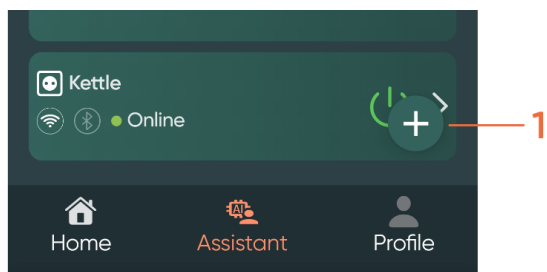
→ A list of detected heaters will appear, displaying their current status. Look for devices marked “**Ready for connection.**”

→ The connection and "Find" signal remain active for 30 minutes after powering on the device.

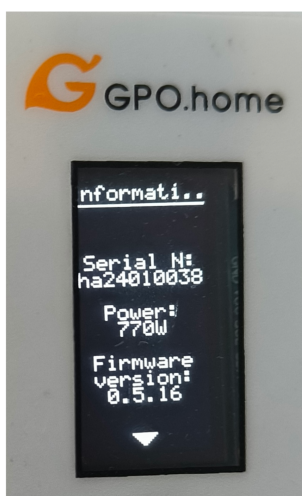
After this period, the message “**Reboot required**” will appear under the device's name and you will need to manually reboot your heater to start the connection process again.

3. **Connect heater:** Tap the heater you wish to connect to.

- 3.1. **Find:** If you need help identifying the correct heater, tap the “Find” button. This will activate the heater’s sound signal.

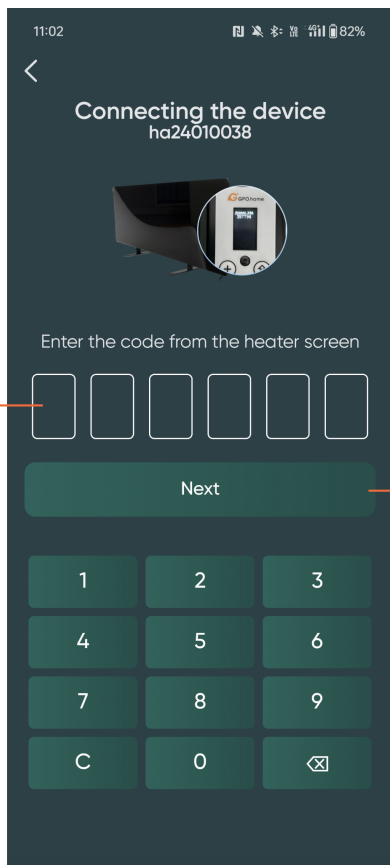

3.2. **Heater's Name:** You can find your heater's name on its display under the "Information" section.

Additional help: If the heater you're trying to connect to doesn't appear on the list, follow the on-screen instructions in the app for additional troubleshooting.



Enter the access code

4. Check the heater's display to find the access code. Input the code exactly as shown on the heater's display.

4.1. This ensures the security of your heater, preventing unauthorized connections.

5. Enter the code exactly as shown, then tap **"Next"** to proceed.

Choose a Wi-Fi network

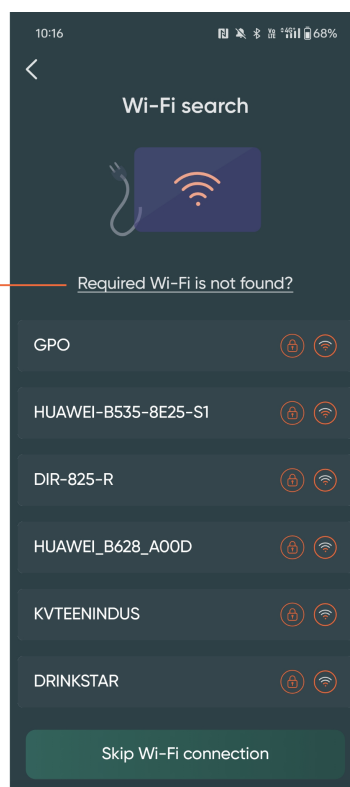
6. A list of detected Wi-Fi networks will appear. Tap the network you want to connect your heater to.

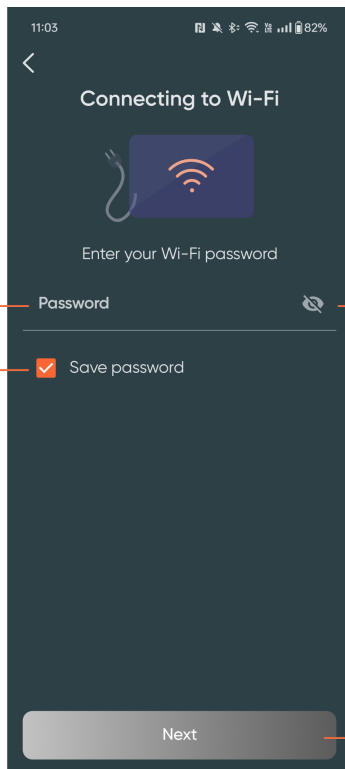
- 6.1. If the desired Wi-Fi network is not listed, tap **"Required Wi-Fi is not found"** for further instructions.

Connecting your heater to a Wi-Fi network significantly expands the range from which you can control it and ensures automatic firmware updates.

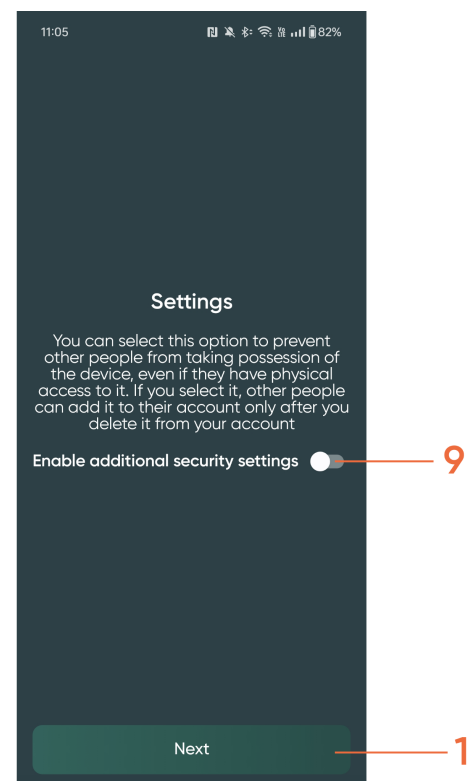


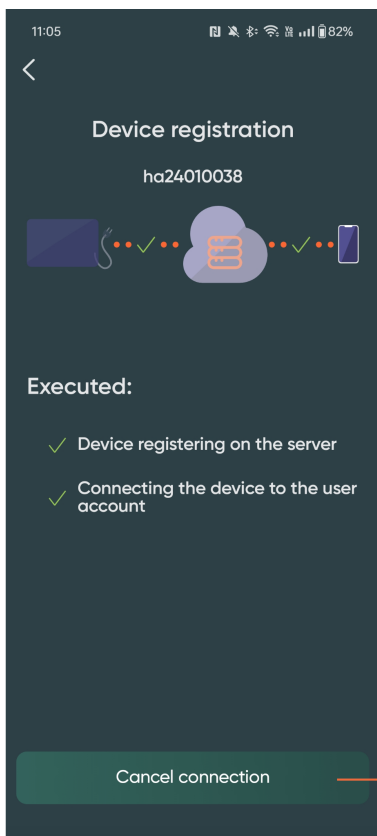
Enter Wi-Fi Password

7. Enter the **password** for the Wi-Fi network you selected.
 - 7.1. Tap the crossed-out eye icon to reveal the password. Tap it again to hide the password.
 - 7.2. Check the box to save your Wi-Fi password for easier access in the future.
8. Tap **“Next”** after entering the correct password to continue.

Additional security settings

9. Slide the **“Enable additional security settings”** button to activate extra security for your heater.
 - 9.1. Enabling this setting locks the heater to your account, preventing other users from accessing it. The heater will only become available to others if you remove it from your account.
10. Tap **“Next”** after making your selection to continue.

Device registration

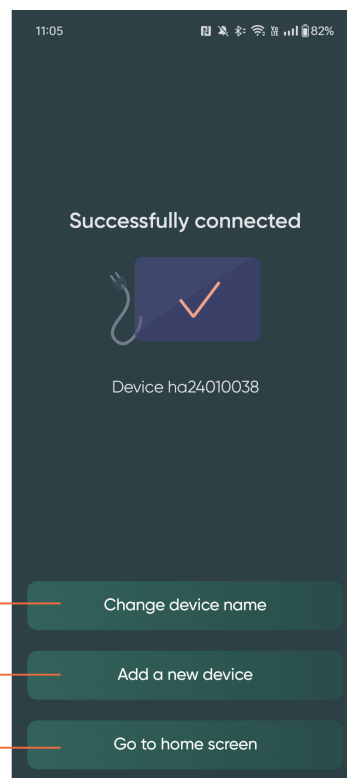
Allow the device to connect to the server and complete the registration process. This will only take a moment. Once registration is complete, you will automatically proceed to the next screen.

Finish

You have successfully registered the heater to your account!

11. To continue, you have three options:

- 11.1. Tap “**Change device name**” to go to a new screen where you can change your heater’s default name (a serial number) to a custom name.
- 11.2. Tap “**Add a new device**” to start adding another heater.
- 11.3. Tap “**Go to home screen**” to return to the home screen and continue setting up your new heater!

ADD A SOCKET

To **add a socket** to your account follow these steps:

1. **Go to the Home Screen:** tap the “+” button in the bottom-right part.
2. **Select Device Type:** From the pop up menu choose the type of device you want to add - in this case the socket.

→ A list of detected devices will appear.

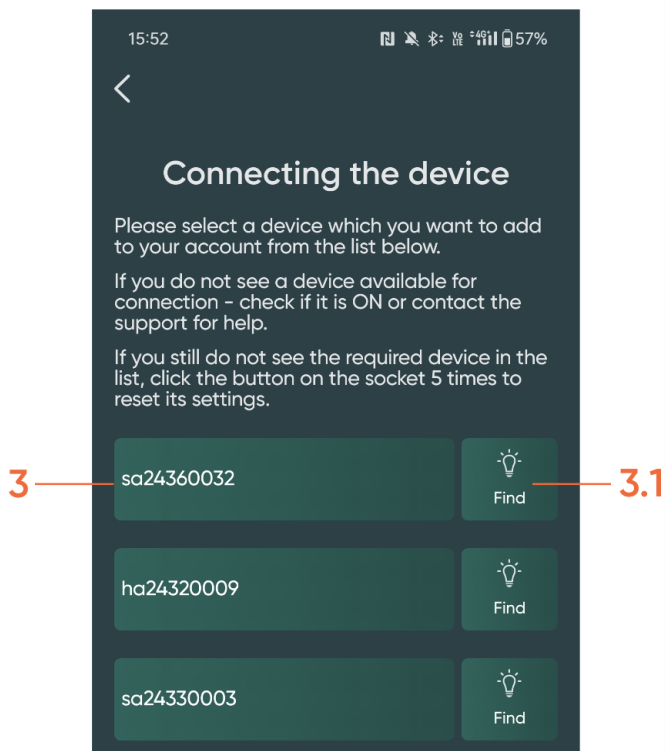
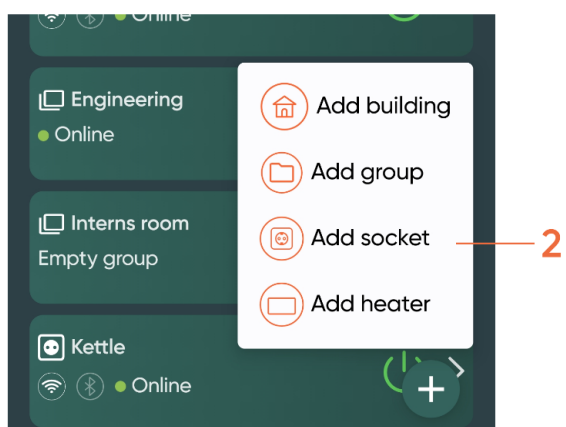
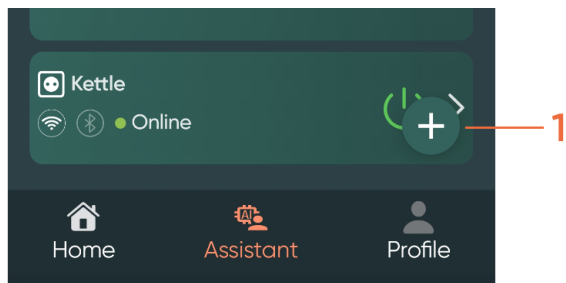
To set it to connection mode press and hold the button on the socket for five seconds until it starts flashing blue.

The connection and "Find" signal remain active for 30 minutes after powering on the socket. After this period you will need to manually reboot your socket to start the connection process again.

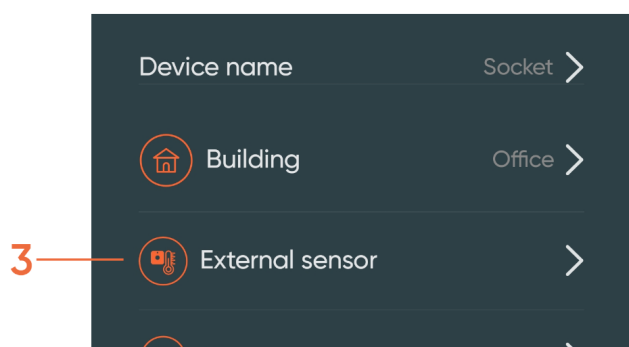
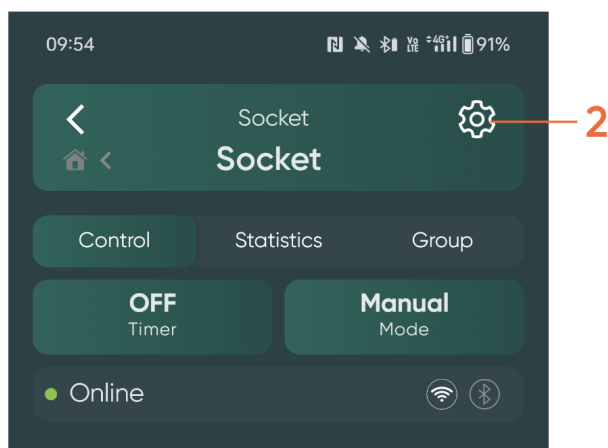
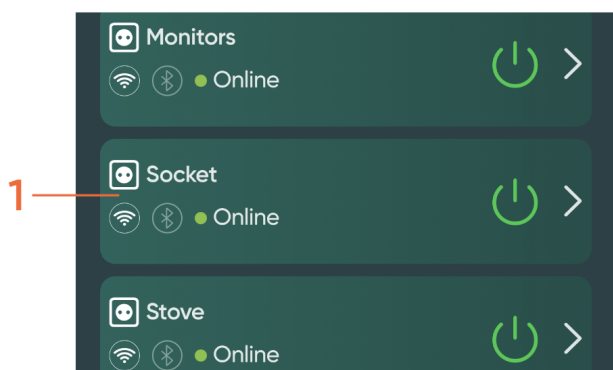
3. **Connect Socket:** Tap the socket you want to connect to.

- 3.1. **Find:** If you need help identifying the correct socket, tap the “Find” button. This will activate the socket’s LED signal and it will start flashing red.
- 3.2. **Socket’s Name:** You can find your socket’s serial number on its body.
- 3.3. **Help:** If the socket you’re trying to connect to doesn’t appear on the list, follow the **on-screen instructions** for additional troubleshooting.

Continue with steps **6-12** of “Add a heater” to finish adding your socket.



ADD A SENSOR

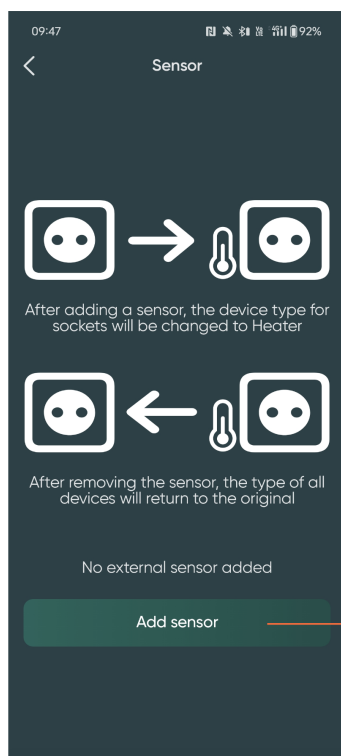


Adding an external sensor to your socket enables temperature control. By plugging in any heater to the socket with an external sensor, the heater becomes a smart heater, adjustable based on the external temperature. In the app, this means a socket with an external sensor is treated as a heater.

You can connect an external sensor to your heater. This allows the heater to be controlled using the external sensor's data, rather than relying on the temperature of its surface.

To **add a sensor** to your device or group of devices follow these simple steps:

1. **Open "Devices" tab:** Open the **devices** tab found on your home screen and find the device or group you want to add the sensor to.
 - 1.1. If you haven't changed the name of your device, it will be a serial number by default.
2. **Open Settings:** Tap **settings** in the top-right corner of the screen.
3. **Add External Sensor:** Choose **"External sensor"** in the settings menu.

4. Tap the “**Add Sensor**” button to continue connecting the sensor
- 4.1. Press the button on the back of the sensor to enable connection mode.

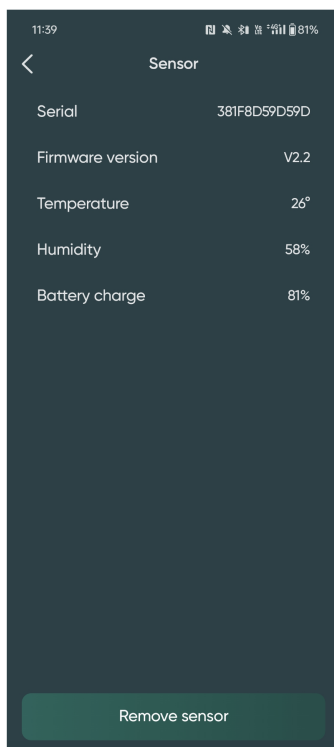
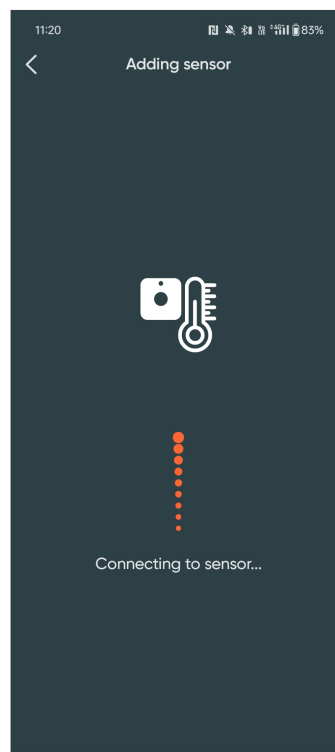
5. You'll see a list of available sensors. Tap the one you want to connect to.

6. Give the app a moment to complete the setup. Once finished, you'll automatically move to the next screen.

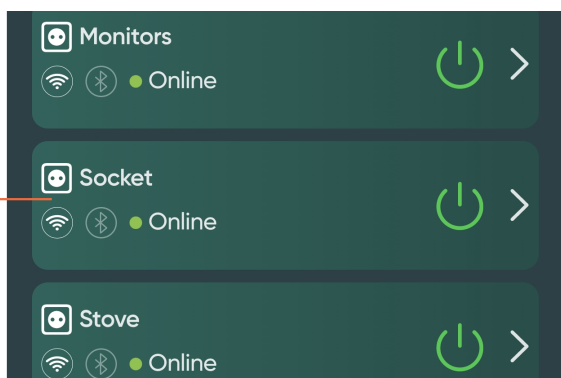

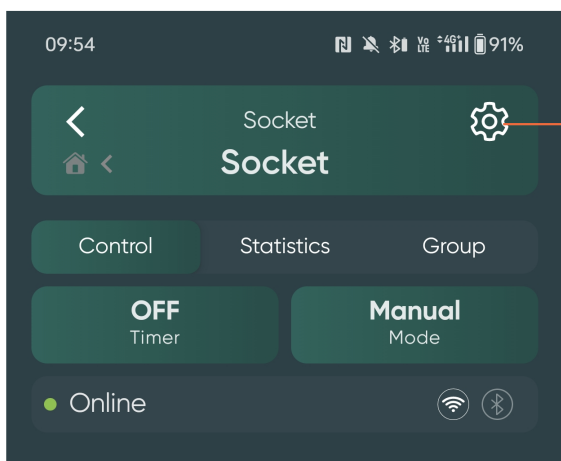
7. On this screen you can view the values measured by the sensor, its battery level and additional technical details. This data may take a while to appear for the first time.
 - 7.1. You can access this screen later through the device's settings to either view the sensor's details or remove it to change for a new one.

DEVICE SETTINGS



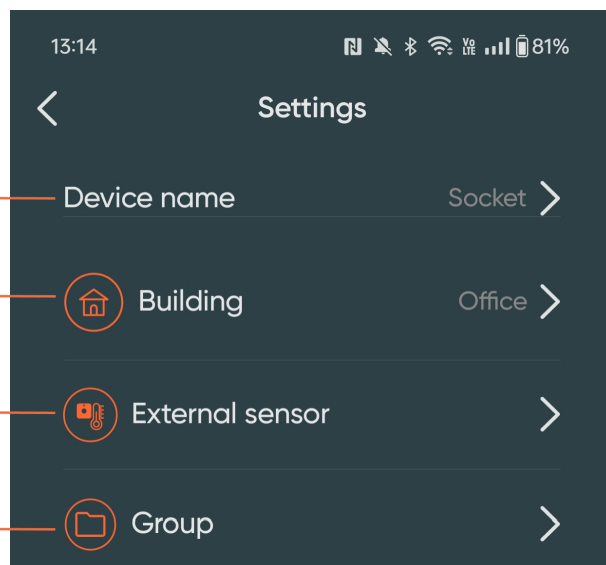
To access a device's settings:

1. On the home screen navigate to the **"Devices"** tab and choose the **device you want to configure**.

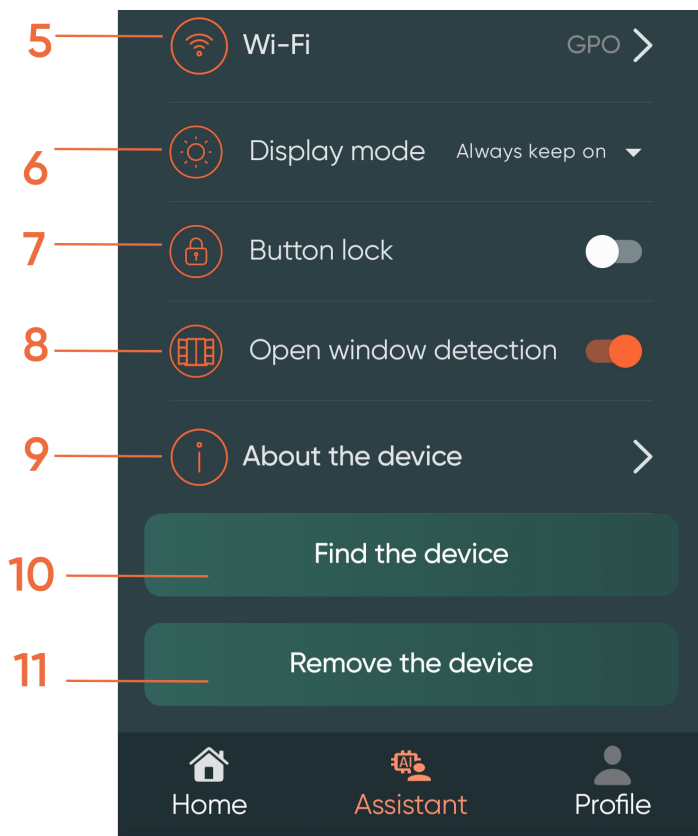


2. In the device menu tap the **settings** menu in the top-right corner.

1. **Device name:** Displayed at the top. Tap to rename the device.
2. **Building:** Displays the building to which the device is assigned (non-editable) and the building's settings.
3. **External Sensor:** Tap to add or remove an external sensor.
4. **Device Group:** Manage the group the device belongs to.

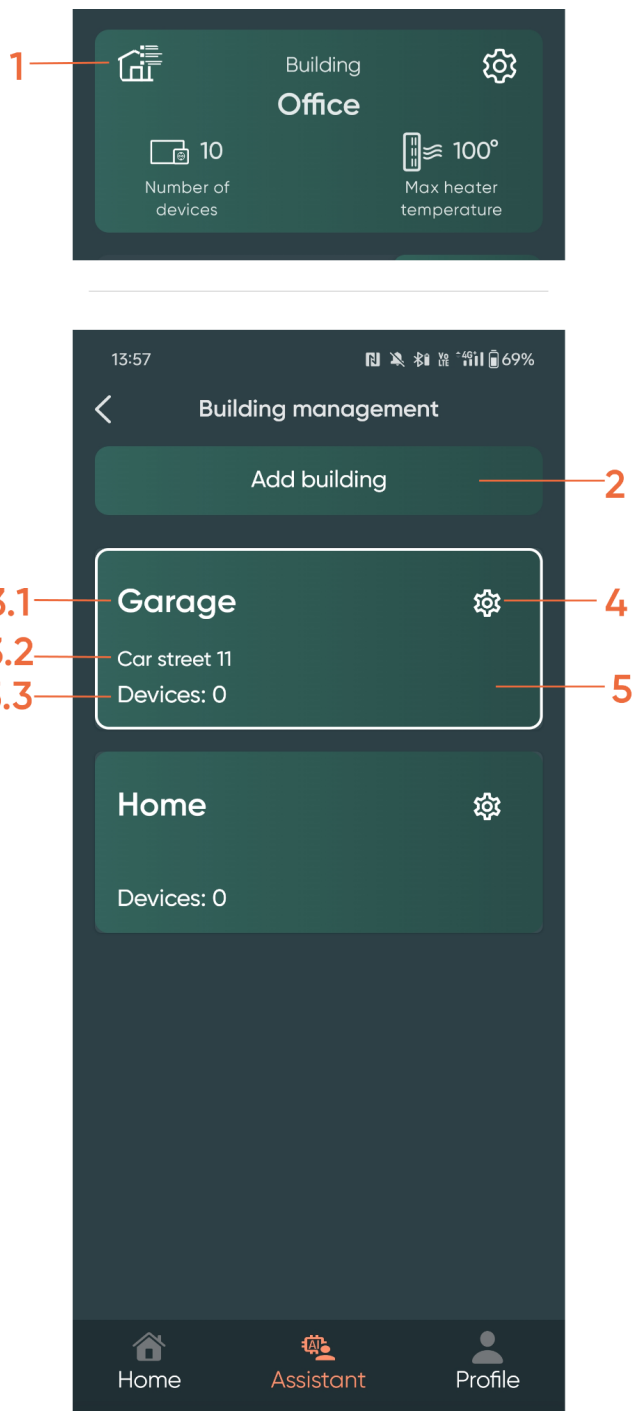


5. **Wi-Fi Network:** Connect your device to a Wi-Fi network or change the current one.
6. **Display Mode:** (Applicable only to the displays on the heaters.) Choose between:
 - 6.1. **Always on:** The heater's screen is always on.
 - 6.2. **Automatic shut-off:** The screen will automatically shut off after 5 minutes of inactivity.
 - 6.3. **On during daytime:** The screen will be kept on from 7:00 to 21:00 and automatically off the rest of the time after 5 minutes of inactivity.
7. **Button Lock:** Use the slider to turn this function ON or OFF. When enabled, the device's buttons will be locked until the function is turned off.
 - 7.1. It can also be turned off on the heater itself by continuously holding the "↑" and "↓" buttons.
8. **Open Window Detection (OWD):** Use the slider to turn OWD ON or OFF.
9. **About the Device:** View technical information, including the serial number, type, maximum power, and firmware version.
10. **Find the Device:** Locate your heater or socket. Tap this option to:
 - 10.1. Emit a sound signal (heater).
 - 10.2. Flash red (socket).
11. **Remove the Device:** Delete the selected device from your account.



*Open Window Detection (OWD) is an energy-saving feature in our home heaters that detects when a window or door is open, often indicated by a sudden drop in room temperature. When activated, the heater temporarily reduces or stops its operation to prevent energy waste. This not only enhances the heater's efficiency but also helps our customers save on energy bills. OWD is included to ensure compliance with the European Ecodesign Directive, which mandates high environmental performance standards for energy-related products. By incorporating OWD, our heaters contribute to sustainability while delivering optimal comfort and cost-effectiveness for your home.

MANAGE BUILDINGS



1. Tap the top-left icon on the home screen to view and manage your buildings.
2. If you'd like to add a new building, tap "**Add building**".

Building overview:

3. Each building has its own tab with information and the option to customize its settings.
 - 3.1. **Building Name:** Displays the name you assigned for your building.
 - 3.2. **Address:** Shows the address you entered for the building.
 - 3.3. **Connected Devices:** Indicates the number of devices added to this building. To see the full list of devices, go to the "Devices" tab on the home screen.

Customization and Controls:

4. **Building Settings:** Tap here to access and customize the building's settings to your preferences**.
5. **Highlight Building:** By tapping a building's tab, you can select which building's controls are displayed on the home screen. The selected building will be highlighted with a white border.

CREATE A BUILDING

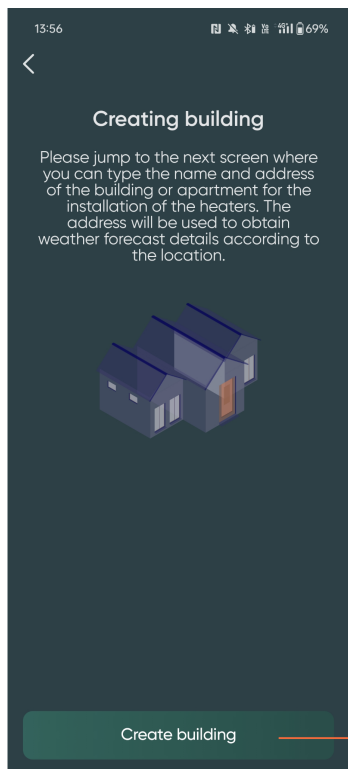
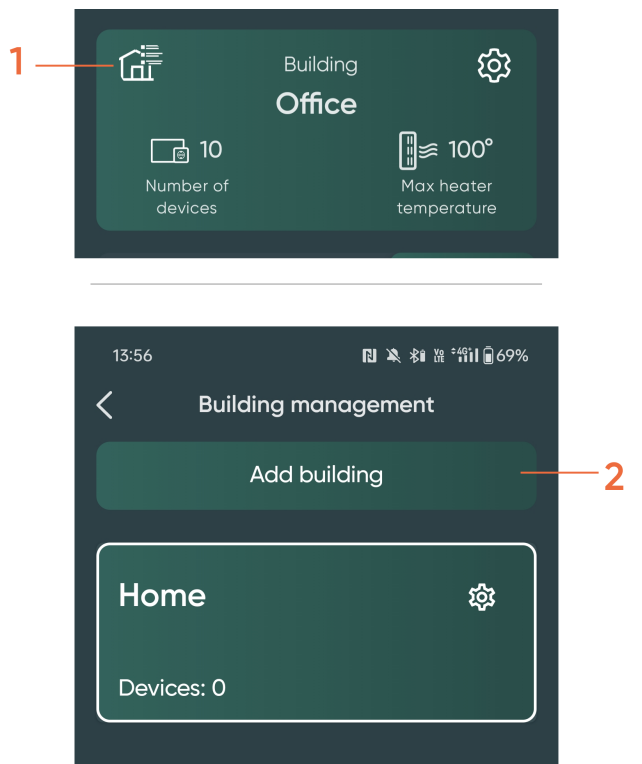
First Building

After logging into the app either with or without registration you'll have your first customizable building by default. To learn how to customize it, refer to the **"Manage your buildings"** section.

New Building

To **create a new building** follow these steps:

1. **Building management:** Tap on the icon in the top-left corner. This will take you to the "Building management" section.
 - 1.1. Alternatively go to the bottom of your home screen, tap the "+" button and choose "Add building".
2. **Add building:** Tap on the "Add building" button.

3. Confirm the creation of a new building by tapping the "Create new building" button.



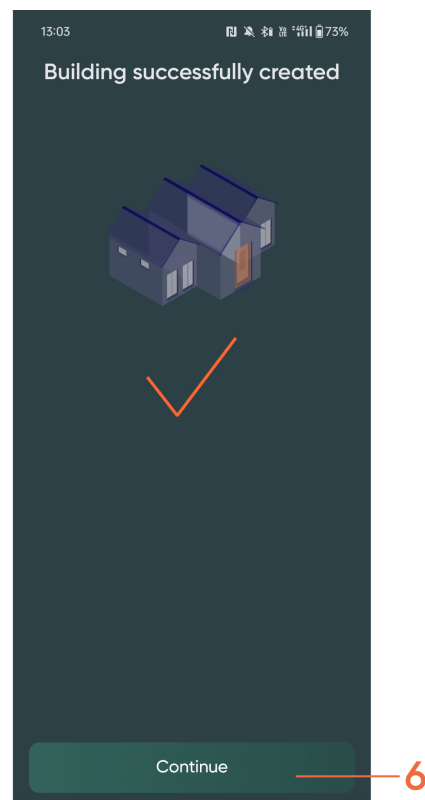

5. Tap the **“Create new building”** button to finalize the creation process.

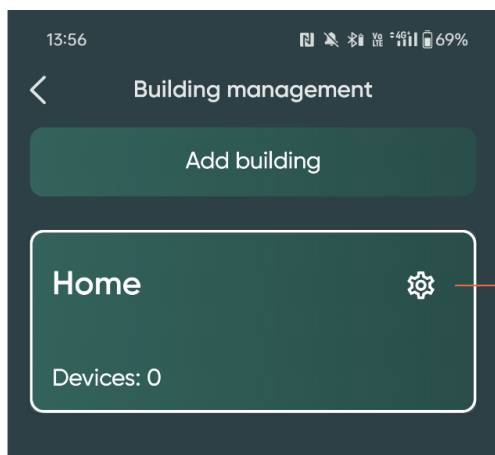

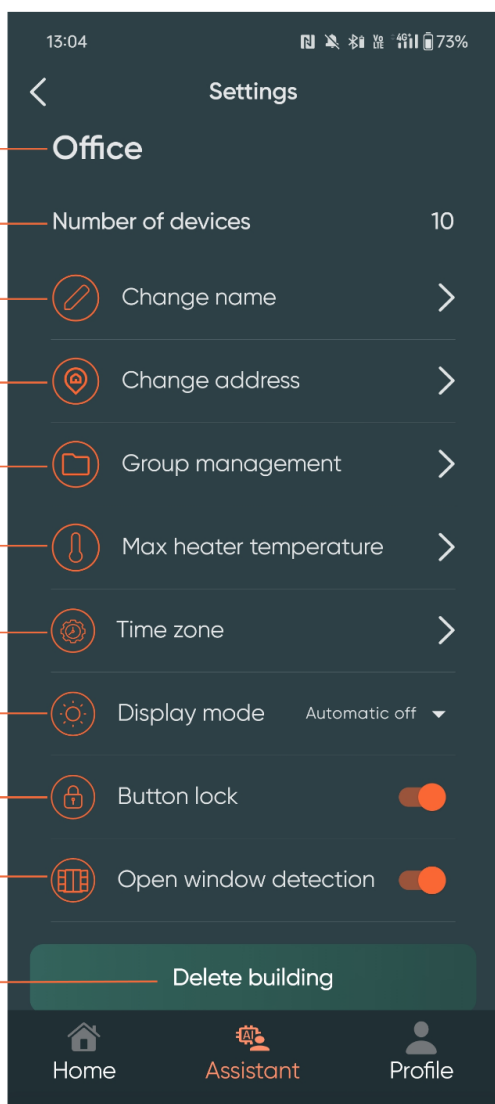
You can access the customization options for each of your buildings through the “**Building management**” screen. Alternatively you can tap on the settings icon on your home screen and it will take you to the settings of your currently chosen building.

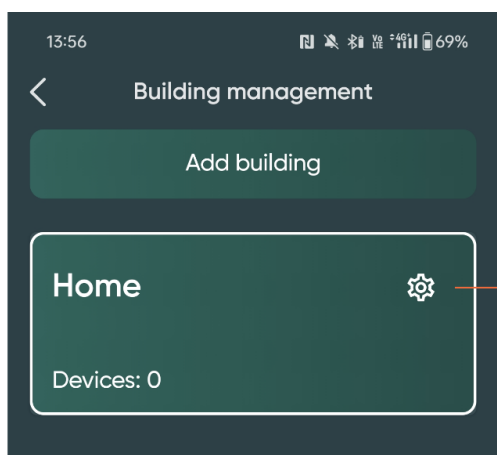
Customize Building Settings

1. To customize the settings of a building through the “**Building management**” screen:
 - 1.1. Go to “Building management”,
 - 1.2. choose the building you want to customize,
 - 1.3. tap on the settings icon of the building.

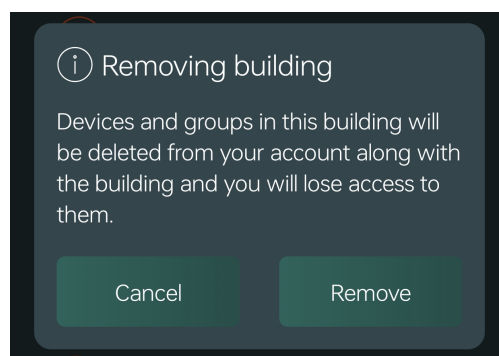

2. **Building name:** Displayed at the top. Tap to rename the building.
3. **Devices:** Number of devices in this building.
4. **Change name:** Tap to rename the building.
5. **Change address:** Tap to change the address.
6. **Group management:** Tap “Group management” to manage groups in your building. Customize your current groups, remove/add new ones.



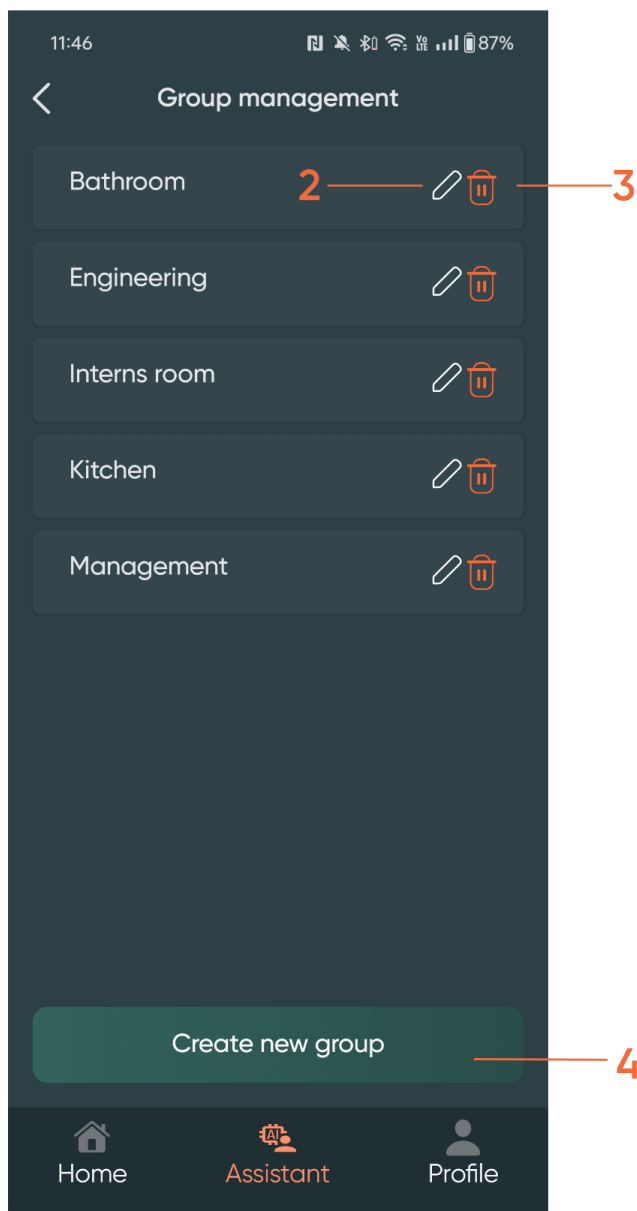
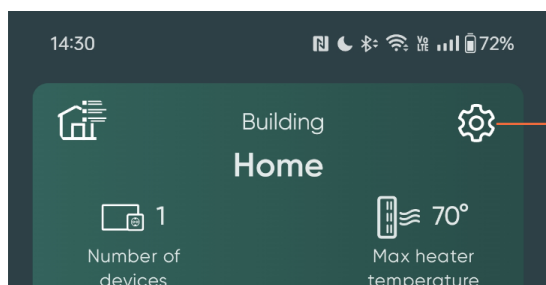


7. **Max heater temperature:** Tap to choose the maximum temperature for the surface of your heaters in your building.
8. **Time zone:** Tap to choose a time zone for your building.
9. **Display Mode:** (Applicable only to heaters.) Choose between:
 - 9.1. **Always on:** Display is always on.
 - 9.2. **Automatic shut-off:** The screen will automatically shut off after 5 minutes of inactivity.
 - 9.3. **On during daytime:** The display will be kept on from 7:00 to 21:00 and automatically off the rest of the time after 5 minutes of inactivity.
10. **Button Lock:** Use the slider to turn this function ON or OFF. When enabled, the device's buttons will be locked until the function is turned off.
11. **Open Window Detection (OWD)*:** Use the slider to turn OWD ON or OFF.
12. **Delete building:** Tap the "Delete building" button to delete your building.
 - 12.1. Beware that deleting a building will also delete all the devices and groups inside the building.

CREATE AND MANAGE GROUPS



A **group** consists of devices and can include both heaters and sockets. It may represent a room, a set of devices with similar functions, or any other collection. While a building can contain both groups and individual devices, grouping them simplifies effective management. You can customize a group similarly to a single device and view its overall power consumption statistics.

Access Group Management

1. You can access the group management screen through your building settings.

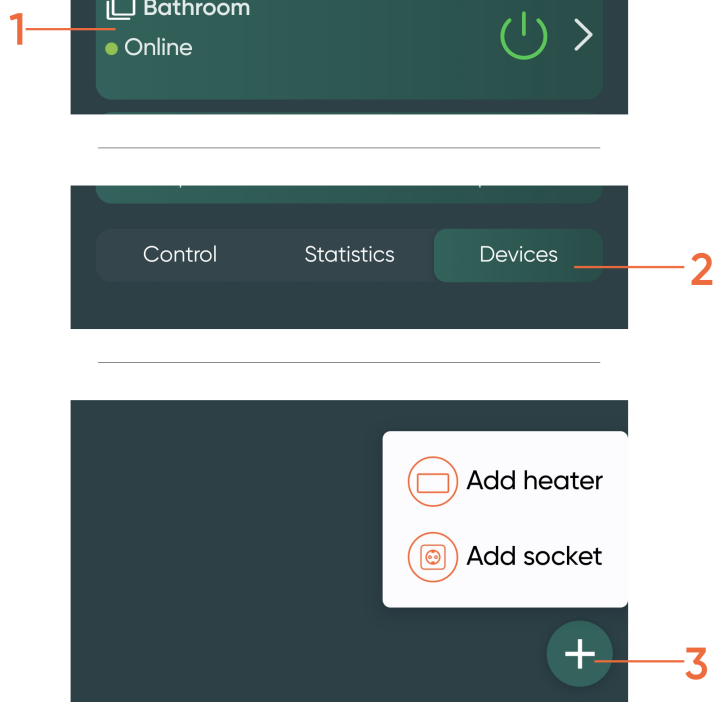
Group List

On the “**Group management**” screen you’ll see the list of your groups in your currently chosen building.

Manage and Customize Groups

2. **Name:** Tap the pencil icon to change a group’s name. A new window will appear where you can enter and confirm the new name.
3. **Delete:** Tap the orange trash can icon to delete a group. A confirmation window will appear. After deletion, all devices left in the group will be automatically moved to the building level.
4. **Create a new group:** You will be prompted to enter a name for the new group.

ADD DEVICES TO A GROUP



There are two ways to add a device to a group:

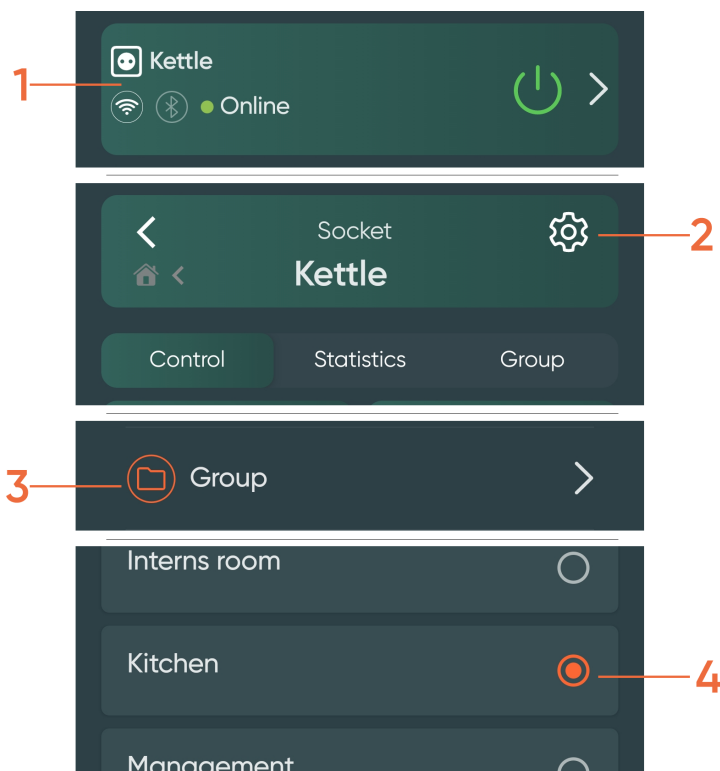
Add a new device

1. **Choose a group:** Find the “**Devices**” tab on the home screen and choose an existing group.
2. **Locate the devices tab:** In the group screen open the “Devices” tab.
3. **Add a device:** Tap on the “+” button in the bottom-right corner of the group screen and choose which device you want to add.
 - 3.1. After choosing the correct group follow the instructions either in the “Add a socket” or “Add a heater” sections.

Add an already connected device

1. **Choose a device:** Find the “Devices” tab on the home screen and choose a device.
2. **Go to settings:** Tap the settings icon in the top-right corner of the device screen.
3. **Group menu:** Tap the “Group” menu option.
4. **Choose a group:** Choose the group you want the device to be assigned to. Just tap on the group’s name and the assigned group will be marked orange. Tap again to unassign.

You can move an already connected device either from a building or from a different group.



MANAGE MODES

Modes

A mode is essentially a planner for temperature settings, allowing your devices to work autonomously. This makes managing your devices more convenient, as you don't need to manually adjust preferences every time. Simply set up a mode, and let the heaters handle everything else. You can create different modes for various situations and switch between them with a tap.

A mode consists of customizable schedules, which can be adjusted by the hour. Schedules consist of the days of the week and repeat on the chosen days.

Modes Menu

There are two ways to access the Modes menu:

Only Heaters in the Building

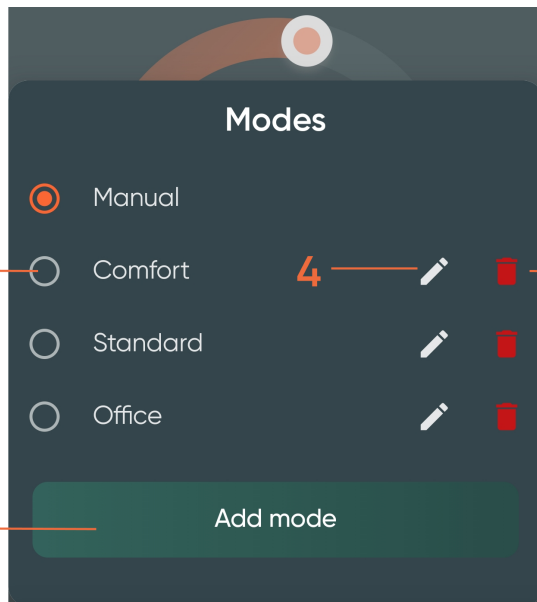
1. If you have only heaters added to your building tap the button displaying the current mode with "Mode" underneath.

Heaters and Sockets in the Building

2. **Devices tab:** If you have both sockets and heaters added to your building go to the "Devices" tab on the Home Screen.
3. **Choose a device:** Choose a device or group you want a mode assigned to*.
4. **Modes:** Tap on the button displaying the current mode with "Mode" underneath.



*Keep in mind that heaters and sockets have different parameters and will need separate modes. A group with both heaters and sockets will require you to set up distinct modes for each category of devices.



List of modes

1. **Implement a mode:** Tap on a mode to select it. The currently chosen mode will be highlighted with an orange dot to the left.
2. **Add modes:** Tap “Add Mode” to create a new mode. This will open a new screen for customization.
3. **Remove modes:** Tap the trashcan icon to delete a mode. You can remove all modes except the manual mode.
4. **Customize modes:** Tap the pencil icon to edit a mode. Several customization options are available.

In addition to the default Manual mode, our heaters come with a set of pre-installed modes for your convenience. There are three pre-installed modes, all customizable to suit your preferences:

Comfort: Creates a warm and inviting atmosphere, perfect for relaxing or entertaining.

Standard: A balanced heating mode that maintains a steady, efficient temperature for everyday use.

Office: Keeps a comfortable temperature during work hours and lowers it when the office is unoccupied, balancing comfort and energy efficiency.

CUSTOMIZE MODES

Create or Edit a Mode

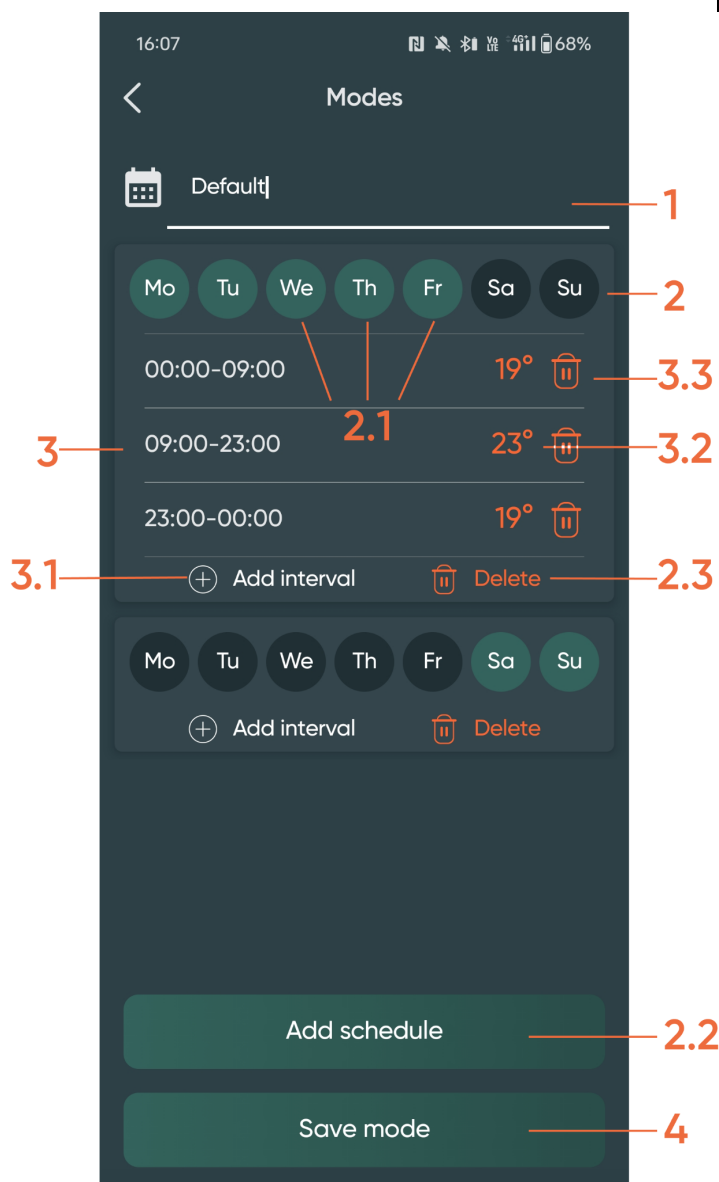
Create a new mode or tap on the pencil icon to edit an existing one.

1. **Name:** Tap here to change the mode's name.

Customize Schedules

Each mode includes:

2. **Schedule:** Design a schedule for a single day or the entire week.
 - 2.1. **Compose a schedule:** Tap on the weekdays to include them in your schedule. Highlighted days are included; dark days are not.
 - 2.2. **New schedule:** Tap "Add schedule" to add another schedule.
 - 2.3. **Delete schedule:** Tap "Delete" below the list of time intervals to delete a schedule.
3. **Hourly Settings:** Assign different temperatures for each hour of the day within your selected schedule. Under every schedule is a list of time intervals for this schedule.
 - 3.1. **Add intervals:** Tap on "Add interval" to define a start and end time with specific temperature settings. This opens a screen to input your details.
 - 3.2. **View temperatures:** See the temperature for each time interval in the list under your schedule.
 - 3.3. **Remove interval:** Tap the trashcan icon to delete an interval.
4. **Save mode:** After customizing your mode, tap "Save mode" to confirm and save your changes.



SET UP A MODE

Easy Walkthrough to Set Up a New Mode

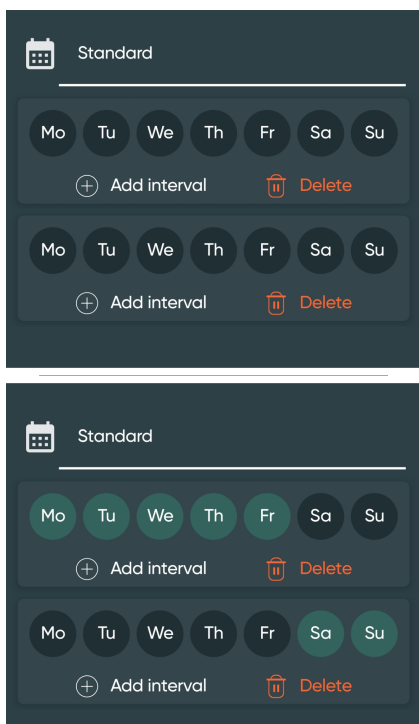
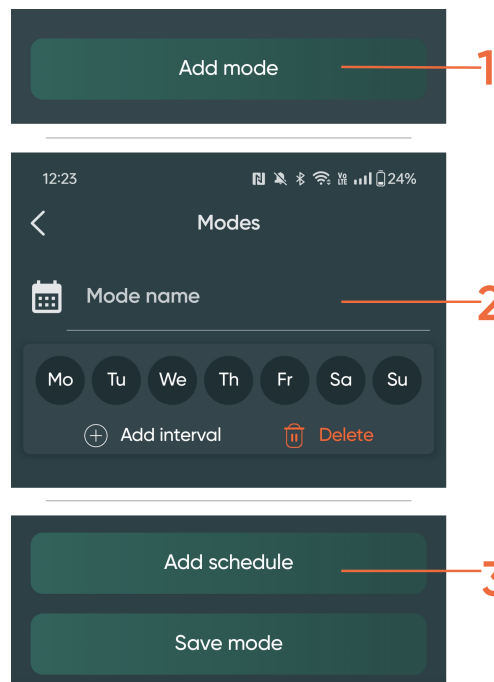
Example: You want your home temperature to be 18 degrees on weekdays while you're at work, and 22 degrees on weekends and in the mornings/evenings of workdays.

Create a new mode

1. **Add new mode:** Go to the modes list and tap "Add new mode".
2. **Name:** Choose a name for your mode.

Create schedules

3. **Schedules:** A new mode will include one default schedule.
 - 3.1. **Add Another Schedule:** Tap "Add Schedule" to create an additional schedule.

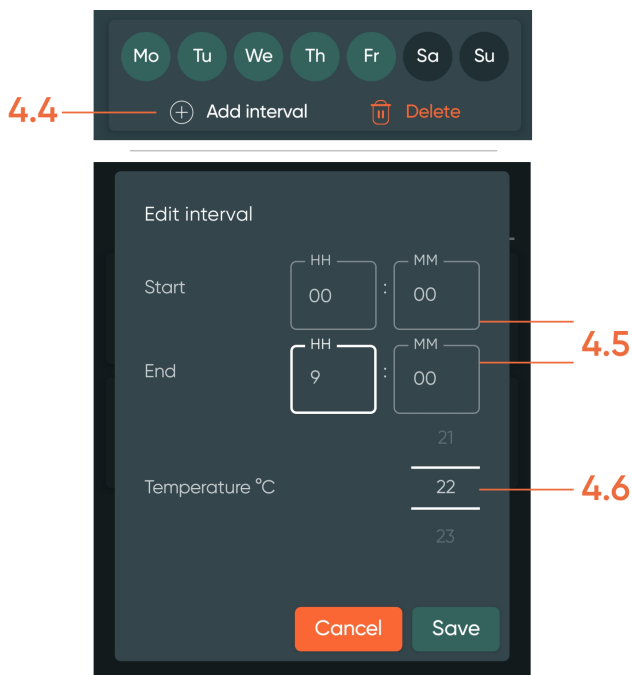
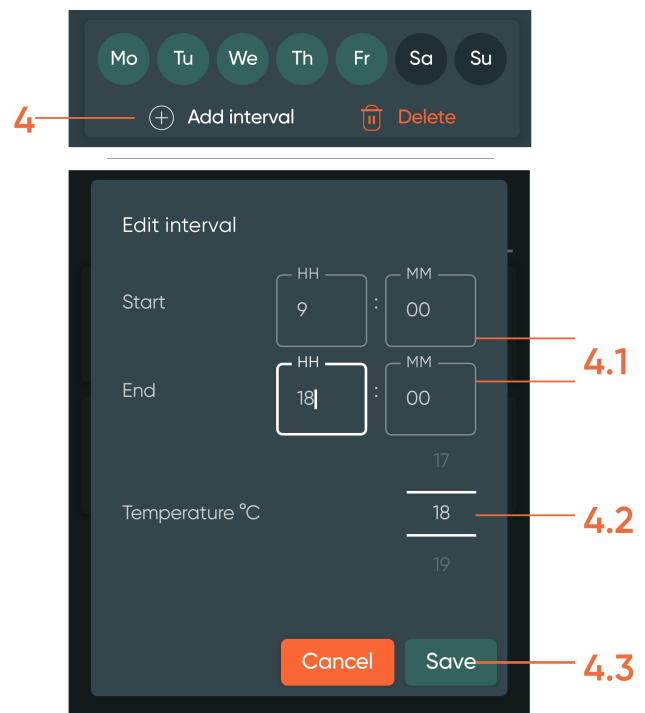


- 3.2. **Choose Days:** Tap on the weekdays in each schedule to include them.

For example, one schedule could include weekdays, and another could cover weekends.

Create hourly intervals

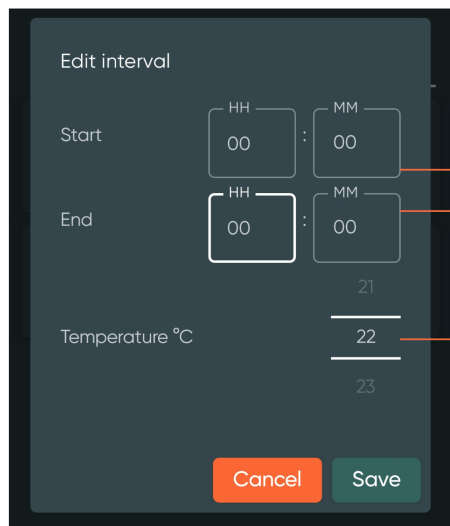
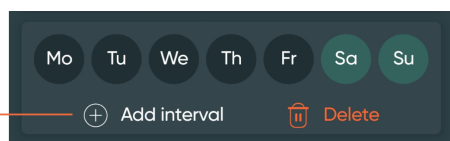
4. **Hourly intervals:** To add time periods, tap “Add interval”. A new menu will appear:
 - 4.1. **Define Start and End Time:** These will be the hours you’re at work. In this example you start work at 9.00 and finish at 18.00.
 - 4.2. **Choose Temperature:** Scroll through the number column to select the desired temperature (e.g., 18 degrees).
 - 4.3. Tap “Save” to continue.



Additional hourly intervals

- 4.4. **Add interval:** Tap “Add interval” again to add a time interval for the first part of the day when you’re home on weekdays.
- 4.5. **Time:** 00:00 - 9:00. This period represents the time before your workday starts.
- 4.6. **Temperature:** 22 degrees.
- 4.7. **Repeat:** Follow the same steps for the time after your workday ends (e.g., 18:00 - 00:00).

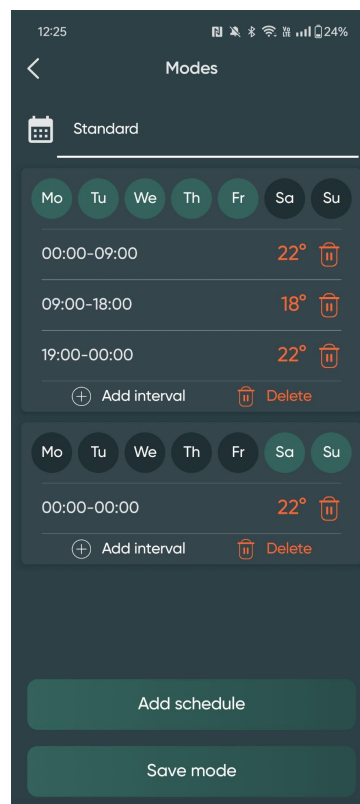
- 4.8. **Add interval:** Tap “Add Interval” under the second schedule to define a time period.
- 4.9. **Assign the time:** Define the time period. In this case it will be a whole day.

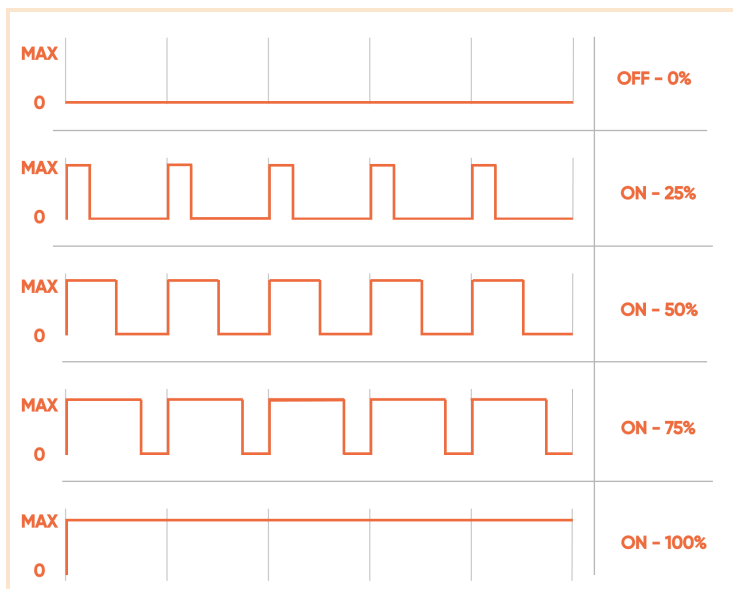

MODE FOR SOCKETS

Configuring a mode for a socket is similar to setting one for a heater but, instead of defining the temperature, involves defining the percentage of time the socket supplies power to the connected device. These percentages reflect **the active power delivery time**, not the device's actual power output.



A simple graphic representation of the timer's working principle.

For instance, setting the socket to 25% reduces energy consumption by 75%, but the device doesn't operate at 25% power. Instead, the socket cycles the device On and Off in evenly distributed intervals.

Operating for two hours at 50% power, the socket provides power for one hour, effectively halving energy use.

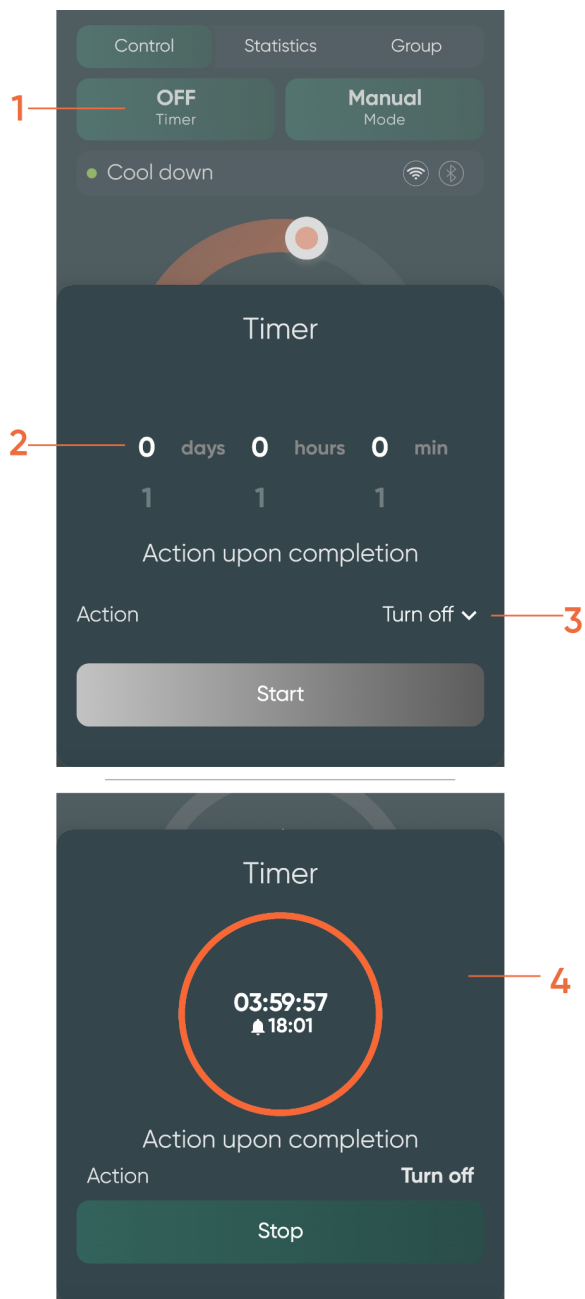
Selecting "OFF - 0%" cuts power to the device without disabling the socket itself.

In the graphic representation - "MAX" and "0" indicate both the device's power level and its operational state. "MAX" signifies that the device is ON and running at 100% power, while "0" indicates it is OFF and consuming 0% power.

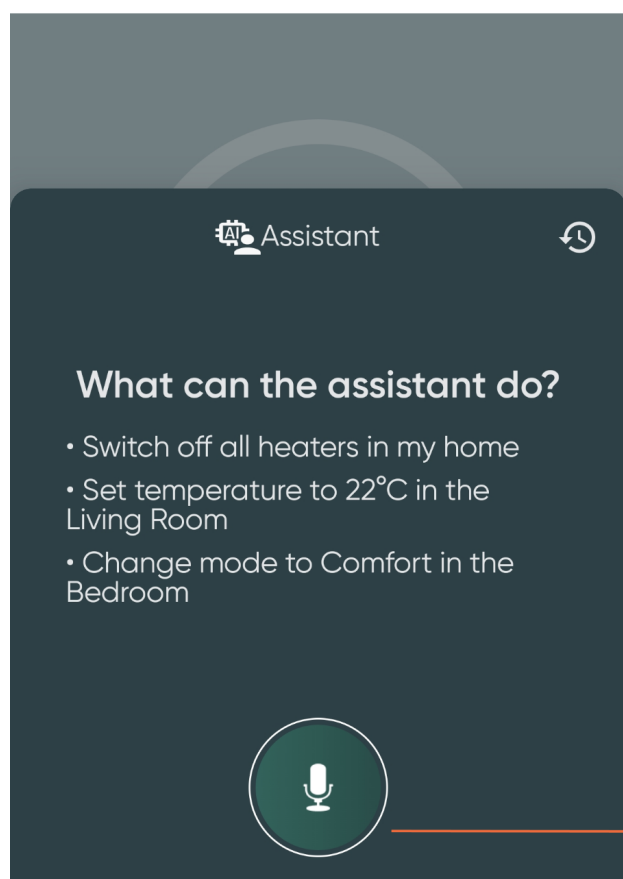
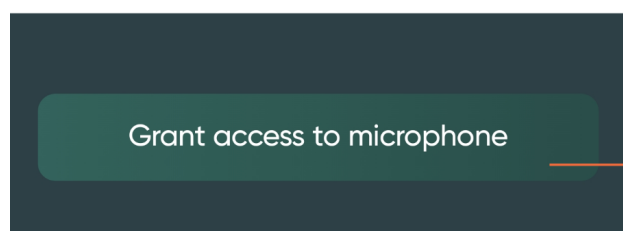
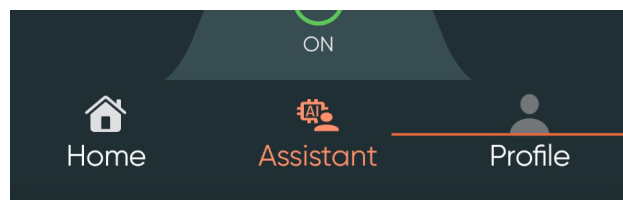
TIMER

The timer allows your device to perform a specific task after a predetermined amount of time has passed. It is particularly useful for automating actions, such as switching modes or shutting off after a set time, ensuring smooth, efficient operation without manual intervention. The timer is available only to registered users.

1. **Timer:** You can find the timer to the left of the current mode button. Tap the “Timer” button to access it.
2. **Set time:** Scroll the columns to set a time value.
3. **Assign action:** Choose an action for the device once the timer expires. The available actions are:
 - 3.1. Turn off
 - 3.2. Turn on
 - 3.3. Switch to mode
4. **Finish:** this is how your screen will look like when the timer is set up.



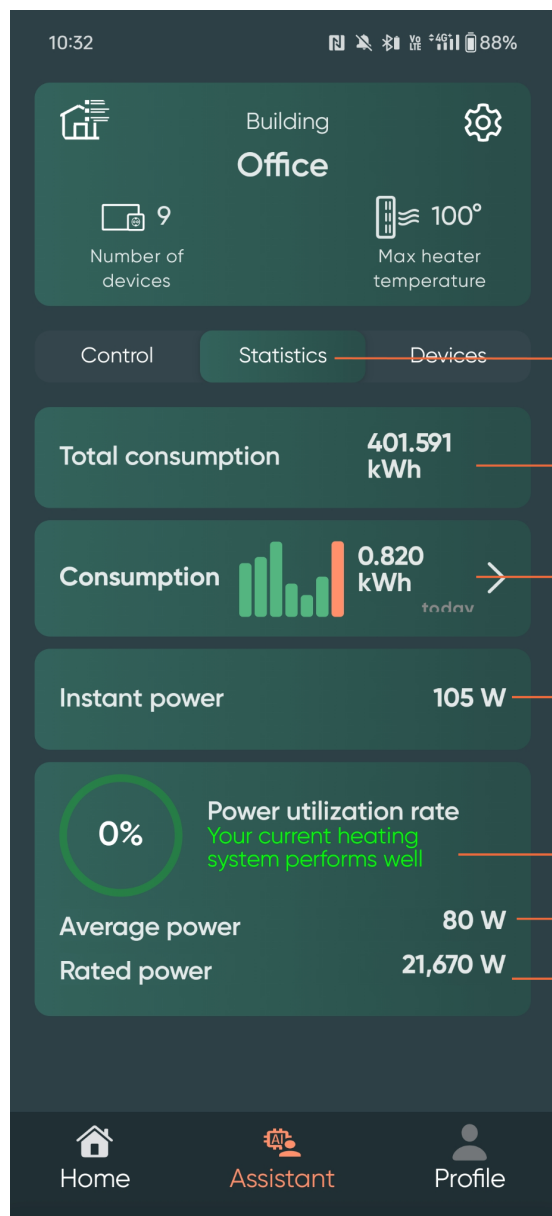
AI ASSISTANT



Controlling your devices becomes more intuitive with our smart AI Assistant. Use voice commands to easily adjust modes, set temperatures, or turn devices on and off. This allows you to fully explore the capabilities of our app, making it easier to manage and customize your smart home experience.

1. **Access:** To access the AI Assistant, navigate to the lower part of your screen and tap “Assistant.”
2. **Grant permission:** When prompted, grant the app permission to use your phone’s microphone. This is necessary for the AI Assistant to process voice commands.
3. **Tap to talk:** To give a command, press and hold the microphone button, say your command, and release when you're done.

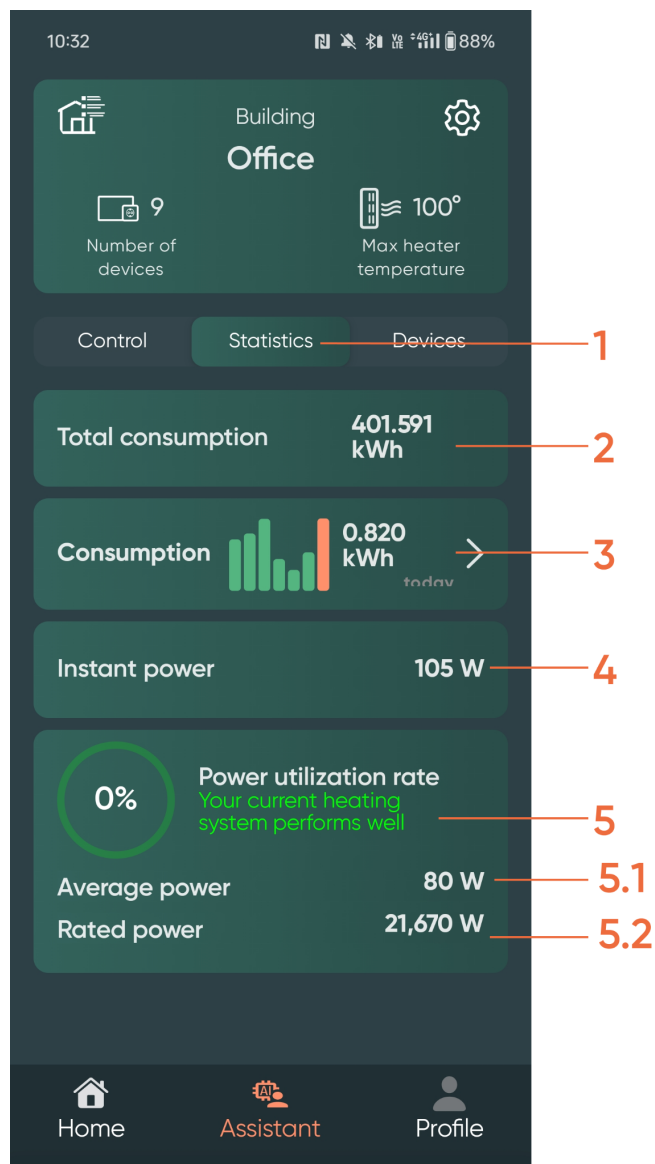

View your consumption data by time periods, specific devices, groups, or even entire buildings. Whether you need a quick summary or detailed insights, the app offers flexible options to suit your needs.

The app also integrates real-time electricity prices from the Exchange, ensuring you stay informed and make cost-effective decisions based on current rates.

Statistics Menu

1. **Access:** To view your statistics, simply navigate to the **"Statistics"** tab.
 - 1.1. If you'd like to see data for a specific group or device, go to the group's or device's menu and select the "Statistics" tab there.
 - 1.2. Accessing statistics through the home screen will display data for your currently selected building.
2. **Total consumption:** Here, you can view the total consumption for your currently chosen building, group, or device across all time periods.



3. **Detailed consumption data:** Tap here to access a more in-depth overview of your power consumption. This will lead you to a new screen where you can analyze data by specific time periods and compare it against electricity prices at the Exchange.

4. **Instant power:** Instant power represents the current amount of power being delivered to your devices.

5. **Power Utilization Rate (PUR):** The power utilization rate indicates how efficiently your system is being used.

It considers both the amount of power being used and the rated power of the heaters or, in the case of sockets, their maximum permitted power output.

If your system is running close to maximum capacity, the PUR will be high and may be displayed in either green (okay) or yellow (high). This helps you assess the load of your system in real-time.

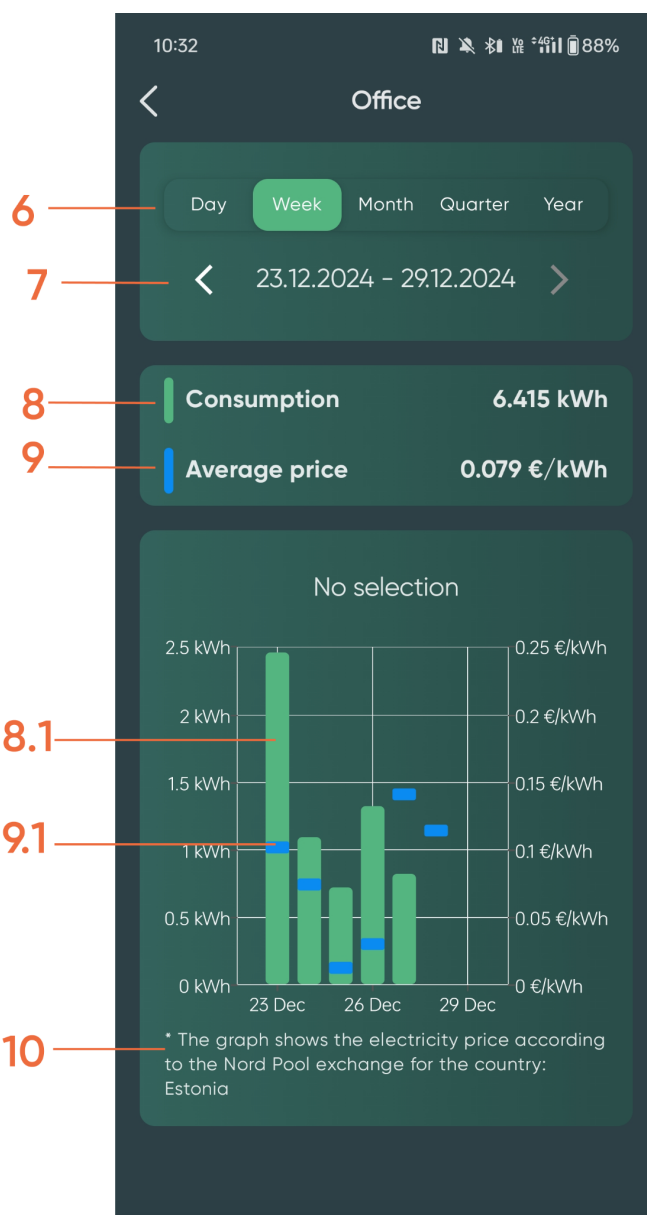
5.1. This is the **average power usage** of a building, group, or device for the last seven days.

5.2. This is the **combined rated power** of your heaters plus the combined maximum power of your sockets depending on the building, group, or device.

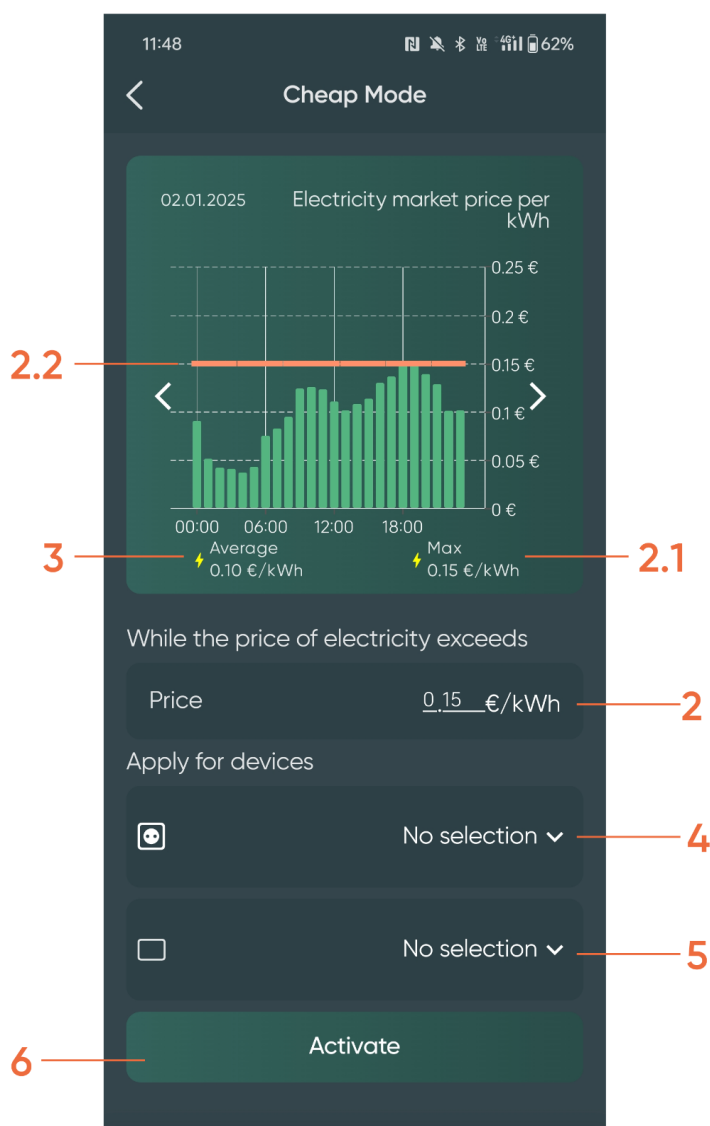
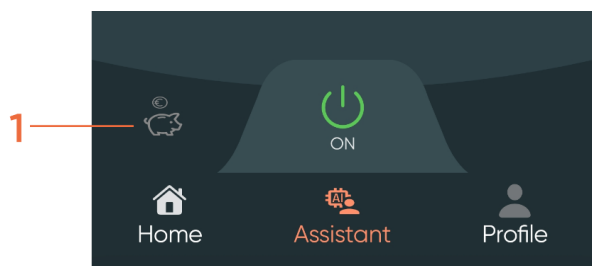
Detailed Statistics

To access detailed statistical data tap “Consumption” in the “Statistics” tab. Here, you can view your consumption data broken down by time periods and easily compare it to electricity prices at the Exchange.

6. **Time period:** Choose a time period to view the data from.
7. **Specific dates:** Scroll through recent dates for a more precise view.
8. **Total consumption:** Displays total consumption within the chosen time period.
 - 8.1. Examine specific segments of the time period by tapping on the green bar to see the exact amount of energy used.
9. **Average electricity price:** Displays the average electricity price for the specified time period according to the Exchange.
 - 9.1. The blue bar marks the price according to the Exchange. Tap on the green bar to see the exact amount of power used and the price for the period.
10. **Country:** View the country for which the prices are displayed.



CHEAP MODE



Cheap Mode is a standalone feature designed to help you manage energy spending more efficiently. Configure your devices to operate based on Exchange prices for optimal savings.

How to Access Cheap Mode

1. Tap the piggybank icon in the bottom-left corner of the screen to access the Cheap Mode settings screen.

Applying Cheap Mode

Apply Cheap Mode to the entire building or customize it for specific devices and groups. To customize the latter, navigate to a device or group's screen and tap the Cheap Mode icon.

Electricity Price Statistics

Tapping the Cheap Mode icon opens a detailed screen with electricity price statistics for the day, helping you make informed decisions.

2. **Maximum electricity price:** Tap here to insert the maximum price of the electricity exceeding which will be performed an action specified in ...
 - 2.1. Current maximum price for the electricity.
 - 2.2. Maximum price represented in the table.
3. **Average price** for electricity at the given day.

Actions for Devices

Depending on which device, group or building you have chosen you will see an option either for sockets, heaters or both:

4. **Choose an action for sockets:** Tap on the “No selection” option to the right of the socket icon to choose an action for the sockets.
5. **Choose an action for heaters:** Tap on the “No selection” option to the right of the heater icon to choose an action for the heaters.
